

the Male Chorus contacted three female singers in Pipestone— Mary Ann Yseth, Jeanine Olson and AnnaBelle Gilmore. They urged them to organize a chorus of 25 women to join with the Male Chorus and sing in the Pipestone Male Chorus's 1978 Spring Concert. After an enthusiastic reception, the women became a permanent organization on their own: the Pipestone Women's Chorus.

In 1979 the two groups performed spring concerts in Pipestone, Ruthton, and Lake Benton. Soon a Christmas concert was added and quickly became a tradition in Pipestone and surrounding communities. By 1980 the two choruses combined and honored their director by naming themselves the Al Opland Singers. Then in the Fall of 1983 the first Dinner Theater show was held and continued to be presented through the fall of 1997.

The Al Opland Singers were determined to carry on Allen Opland's love of music and standard of excellence after his passing in 1984.

The shows that the Opland Singers put on include solos, mixed ensembles, duets and barbershop along with dancing, glamorous costumes & dialogue. The group used to travel around the surrounding area to perform. The home performance venue was originally the Pipestone High School auditorium, but the group also traveled to put on shows at the Lake Benton Opera House, the Ruthton School Gym, as well as venues in Edgerton, Jasper, and Luverne, Minnesota. The Al Opland Singers no longer travel, but perform four shows each season (Christmas & Spring) at the Pipestone Performing Arts Center, which was opened for business in 1993.

The Al Opland Singers' performances cover many genres of music, including excerpts from Broadway musicals, popular songs, sacred and secular Christmas music, patriotic songs, as well as spirituals. However, the shows are not limited to music. Musicals, plays and smaller sections of each have been performed over the years.

Lasting Legacies

The performing arts enriches the lives of all who take part in it, on either side of the stage lights. In an age when we often stream content isolated in our homes, the theater keeps small towns like ours vibrant and vital. Sitting in a collective, communal space, side by side, is a transformative community experience.

We owe our gratitude to the generous donors who've supported us over 30 years. Without their contributions, we couldn't sustain our operations. Local businesses and organizations have been steadfast Underwriters season after season. You can see a current list of the Underwriters featured on the next spread. These Underwriters keep ticket prices accessible for our Presenter Series events which have been a great success in bringing regional professional acts to the Pipestone Performing Arts Center.

Among the many, many donors, there is one individual who deserves a special mention. The Pipestone Performing Arts Center was the recipient of an exceptional gift and challenge in 2008 by Deeann Griebel, who established an endowment in memory of her aunt, Betty Rickerman. With \$25,000 raised locally, this endowment equaled an incredible \$145,000. According to Deeann, the Endowment and challenge was to "help create a sense of community!" In response, the Pipestone Performing Arts Center Foundation was established.

Live events require a diverse range of skills from numerous individuals behind the scenes. Often, as audience members, we don't get to witness the dedicated puppeteers dressed in black, pulling strings, operating buttons, sewing costumes, painting sets or board members who have served year after year. Our organizations have thrived thanks to countless loyal volunteers, technicians and board members.

Artists have certainly made their mark on these organizations, but it's heartwarming to see how the groups, in turn, have woven their influence into the lives of those who've generously shared their time and talents. Many people, from all walks of life, have entered and exited our stage during that time. But a few familiar faces and stars of our theater have left a lasting legacy. We would like to recognize and pay tribute to these puppeteers and ring masters of the Pipestone Performing Arts Center.



Galen Dalin

1927-2005

With a background and education in social studies, english and speech,
Galen was the chairman of the High School Speech
Department and directed plays for 36 years. He brought

these gifts and talents to the original task force of the Pipestone Performing Arts Center in 1992, and would continue to serve on the board for many years, and as president. You would often find Galen wearing a headset up in the light booth. The PPAC is a beneficiary of the Galen and Darline Dalin trust. Galen and Darline have left a lasting legacy on the PPAC that will last generations.

Les Kallsen

1927-2015

Les served on the
Pipestone Performing Arts
Center board for many
years and as President. He
was active in fund-raising
and grant writing during his
time on the board. Les performed

in and directed numerous productions for the Calumet Players and the Al Opland Singers.

Allen Opland

1918-1984

Pipestone's very own
Music Man. The PPAC's
roots can be traced back to
the legacy of Al Opland. He
earned dozens of prestigious
awards and his music groups
earned scores of honors. He was

posthumously named to the Minnesota Music Educators Hall of Fame in 1999 and was inducted as one of the first members of the Pipestone Area Instrumental Hall of Fame in 2008. His attention to detail also produced one of the finest band reputations in the area. His impact on his students and community members is what led to the creation of this space.

Jim Hintermeister

1932-2022

A man of many talents, he was a factorum of the Pipestone Performing Arts Center from 1992 to 2006, serving as the House Manager and Photographer,

among many other titles that

kept this special place vibrant and well. He kept a detailed, photographic record of all of the productions that took place on the PPAC stage in the first decade and a half.


